The Services to be provided by the Consultant will last about 46 months, which includes 1 month for pre-Commencement activities, 30 months of works supervision, 12 months covering defects notification period and 3 months for the Performance Certificates issue and other closing activities, Final Account and Contract close-out.

The Consultant, with due diligence, will carry out the duties of the Engineer assigned to him in the Contract and provide other services as described in the ToR and Instructions to Consultant.

Procurement will be undertaken in accordance with the policies of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development detailed in the EBRD Procurement Policies and Rules ("PP&R") and the Guidelines for Clients Managing Donor or Loan Funded Consultancy Assignments ("Guidelines") - which can be found at the following website: www.ebrd.com, this procurement notice, and the Instructions to Consultants.

The procurement method is Consultancy Single Stage Open.
